

Each year the American Public Works Association (APWA) presents the Public Works Projects of the Year awards recognizing the best of the best to promote excellence in the management and administration of public works projects, recognizing alliance between managing agencies, the contractor, the consultant and their cooperative achievements. This year's awards were recognized at the APWA's Public Works Expo PWX 2018 awards ceremony August 27 in Kansas City, Missouri.
