8	AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE CONCERNING
9	THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID -19) PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY
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11	WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020 Jared Polis, the Governor of the State of Colorado,
12	declared a statewide state of emergency in response to coronavirus (COVID-19); and
13	WITEPEAC the World Health Organization has dealand the companying (COVID 10) to
14 15	WHEREAS, the World Health Organization has declared the coronavirus (COVID-19) to be a worldwide pandemic; and
16	be a wondwide pandenne, and
17	WHEREAS, the coronavirus (COVID-19) has been confirmed to exist in Summit
18	County; and
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20	WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Breckenridge confirms that protecting
21	public health is the Council's top priority; and
22 23	WHEREAS, the Town Council is empowered by Section 31-15-401(1)(b), C.R.S., to do
23 24	all acts and make all regulations which may be necessary or expedient for the promotion of
25	health or the suppression of disease; and
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27	WHEREAS, the Town Council finds and determines that the adoption of this ordinance is
28	necessary for the promotion of health and the suppression of disease; and
29 30	WHEREAS, the Town Council further finds and determines that the adoption of this
31	ordinance is proper under Section 31-15-401(1)(b), C.R.S., and other applicable law.
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33	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF
34	BRECKENRIDGE, COLORADO:
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36 37	<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Title</u> . This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "Town of Breckenridge Coronavirus (COVID-19) Ordinance."
38	Breckennuge Coronavirus (COVID-19) Ordinance.
39	Section 2. Intent. It is the intent of this ordinance to provide the necessary organization,
40	powers, and authority to enable the timely and effective use of all available Town resources to
41	prepare for, respond to, and recover from the declared local public health emergency. This
42	ordinance is intended to grant as broad a power as is permitted within the letter and spirit of the
43 44	Town Charter and the Council-Manager form of government, and this ordinance shall be interpreted in accordance with such intent. The Town Council retains the power to direct the

Town Manager during the pendency of the current coronavirus (COVID-19) public health
 emergency.

4 Section 3. Public Health Emergency Declared. The Town Council hereby declares that a 5 public health emergency relating to the coronavirus (COVID-19) exists within the Town. Such 6 circumstance is referred to in this ordinance as the "public health emergency." The public shall 7 be notified of this declaration through general dissemination to the news media, posting on the 8 Town website, or other means of publicity intended to advise the general public. 9 10 Section 4. Duration of Declaration of Public Health Emergency. The declaration of the 11 public health emergency as provided in Section 3 of this ordinance shall remain in effect until the 12 Mayor declares that the emergency has passed. 13 14 Section 5. Continuity of Government. Section 15.8 of the Town Charter concerning 15 continuity of government shall apply, if circumstances warrant, during the duration of the public 16 health emergency. 17 18 Section 6. Powers: Until the Mayor declares that the public health emergency has passed 19 the Town Manager has full power and authority to take the following actions and issue the 20 following orders: 21 22 any action necessary for the protection of life and property, including, but not (a) 23 limited to, establishing regulations governing conduct related to the cause of the public health 24 emergency. 25 an order establishing a curfew during such hours of the days or nights and (b) 26 affecting such categories of persons as may be designated. 27 an order to direct and compel the evacuation of all or a part of the population from (c) 28 any stricken or threatened areas within the Town if the Town Manager deems this action is 29 necessary for the preservation of life, property or other public health emergency mitigation, 30 response or recovery activities and to prescribe routes, modes of transportation and destination in 31 connection with an evacuation. 32 an order controlling, restricting, allocating or regulating the use, sale, production (d) 33 or distribution of food, water, clothing, and other commodities, materials, goods, services and 34 resources. 35 an order requiring the closing of businesses deemed nonessential by the Town (e) 36 Manager. 37 (f) suspend Town board and commission meetings to include, but not be limited to, 38 meetings of the Planning Commission, Breckenridge Open Space Advisory Commission, and 39 Liquor and Marijuana Licensing Authority, or modify meeting rules to allow for telephone, 40 teleconferencing or meeting by other electronic means. 41 appropriate and expend funds, execute contracts, authorize the obtaining and (g) 42 acquisition of property, equipment, services, supplies and materials without the strict compliance 43 with procurement regulations or procedures. 44 transfer the direction, personnel, or functions of Town departments and agencies (h) 45 for the purposes of performing or facilitating public health emergency services. utilize all available resources of the Town as may be reasonably necessary to cope 46 (i)

1 with this public health emergency whether in preparation for, response to, or recovery from this 2 public health emergency. 3 suspend or modify the provisions of any ordinance if strict compliance with such (i) 4 ordinance would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with this public 5 health emergency. 6 (k) accept services, gifts, grants and loans, equipment, supplies, and materials whether 7 from private, nonprofit or governmental sources. 8 .make application for local, state or federal assistance. (1) 9 terminate or suspend any process, operation, machine, device or event that is or (m) 10 may negatively impact the health, safety and welfare of persons or property within the Town. 11 (n) delegate authority to such Town officials as the Town Manager determines 12 reasonably necessary or expedient. 13 limit the use of any Town-owned building, facility, or property as to time, manner, (0)14 and permitted activities, including, but not limited to, limiting the permissible number of people that may lawfully occupy such building, facility, or property at any one time. 15 16 close and prohibit the use of any Town-owned building, facility, or property. (p) 17 exercise such powers and functions in light of the exigencies of this public health (q) 18 emergency, including, but not limited to, the waiving of compliance with any time consuming 19 procedures and formalities, including notices, as may be prescribed by law pertaining thereto. 20 (r) issue any and all other order or undertake such other functions and activities as 21 the Town Manager reasonably believes is required under the circumstances to protect the health, 22 safety, welfare of persons or property within the Town of Breckenridge, or to otherwise preserve 23 the public peace or abate, clean up, or mitigate the effects of the public health emergency. 24 25 The restrictions may be changed from time to time during the time frame of the 26 declaration based upon the discretion of the Town Manager. 27 28 Section 7. Enforcement Of Orders: 29 30 (a) The members of the Town's Police Department, code enforcement, and such other 31 law enforcement and peace officers as may be authorized by the Town Manager are herby 32 authorized and directed to enforce the orders, rules, and regulations made or issued pursuant to 33 this ordinance. All members of the public shall be deemed to have been given notice of all 34 orders, rules, and regulations made or issued pursuant to this ordinance upon their dissemination 35 to the news media or publication on the Town website or other means of publicity. 36 (b) Until the Mayor declares that the public health emergency has passed, no person 37 shall: 38 (1) enter or remain upon the premises of any establishment not open for business to 39 the general public, unless such person is the owner or authorized agent of the establishment. 40 violate the provisions of this ordinance. (2)41 violate any of the orders duly issued by the Town Manager or designee pursuant to (3) 42 Section 6 of this ordinance. 43 (4)willfully obstruct, hinder, or delay any duly authorized Town officer, employee or 44 volunteer in the enforcement or exercise of the provisions of this ordinance, or of the undertaking 45 of any activity pursuant to this ordinance.

1 (c) It is unlawful and a misdemeanor offense for any person to violate any provision 2 of this Section 7. Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be subject to the 3 penalties set forth in section 1-4-1 of the <u>Breckenridge Town Code</u>.

5 Section 8. Authority To Enter Property: During the period of the public health 6 emergency, a Town employee or authorized agent may enter onto or upon private property if the 7 employee or authorized agent has reasonable grounds to believe that there is a true emergency 8 and an immediate need for assistance for the protection of life or property, and that entering onto 9 the private land will allow the person to take such steps to alleviate or minimize the emergency 10 or disaster or to prevent or minimize danger to lives or property from the declared public health 11 emergency.

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Section 9. Town Council Meetings And Departments:

15 (a) For the duration of the public health emergency, if a Town Council member reasonably determines that his or her personal attendance at a Town Council meeting would not 16 17 be prudent, such Council member may listen by telephone, video conferencing, or other electronic means to any Council meeting ("Electronic Participation"). Such Council member 18 19 listening via telephone or other electronic means shall be deemed present for purposes of 20 determining a quorum. The member of Town Council may not participate nor vote in a quasi-21 judicial public hearing; however, the Council member may maintain the electronic connection 22 and monitor and listen to the hearing. The member of Town Council may participate and vote in 23 legislative matters. Electronic Participation is also available to a Town Council member during 24 an executive session. The Town Council may discontinue the use of Electronic Participation by 25 one or more members during a meeting where the participation results in delays or interference 26 in the meeting process; e.g., where the telephone connection or connection by other electronic 27 means is repeatedly lost, the quality of the connection is unduly noisy or otherwise problematic 28 to the conduct of the meeting, or the listening member is unable to hear speakers using a normal 29 speaking voice amplified to a level suitable for the meeting audience in attendance. Whenever a 30 Town Council member is allowed to participate in a Town Council meeting by telephone or other electronic means pursuant to this Rule, the following additional rules shall be observed: 31 32

(1) All members of the Town Council must be able to hear one another or otherwise
 communicate with one another, and be able to hear all discussion and testimony in a manner
 designed to provide maximum notice and participation;

36 (2) Members of the public present at the meeting location must be able hear all
 37 discussion, testimony, and votes;

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(3) All votes held at the meeting shall be conducted by roll call.

39 (4) To the extent possible, full and timely notice shall be given to the public setting
40 advising that one or more members of the Town Council may participate in the meeting
41 electronically.

42 (5) Participation in a regular Town Council meeting by telephone or other electronic
43 means in accordance with this Rule shall not be considered to be a "failure to attend" a regular
44 Council meeting for determining whether a vacancy in the office of the Mayor or a Council
45 member has occurred under Section 4.8(b) of the Town Charter.

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1 (b) Whenever the public health emergency makes it imprudent or impossible for Town 2 Council, or any Town board, commission, or committee, to meet at a previously scheduled date 3 and time, such meeting shall be deemed to be postponed until a quorum of the Town Council or 4 Town board, commission, or committee is able to meet, not to exceed one (1) week. 5 6 (c) Any official act or meeting required to be performed at any regular location of the 7 Town Council board, commission, or committee or any Town department is valid when 8 performed at any temporary location under this section. 9 10 (d) The provisions of this section shall apply to all executive, legislative, and judicial 11 branches, powers and functions conferred upon the Town and its officers, employees, and 12 authorized agents by the Colorado Constitution, Colorado Statutes, the Town Municipal Code, 13 including the Town Charter. 14 15 Section 10. Access To Tabor Funds: During the current public health emergency the 16 Town Manager shall have access to the Town's emergency funds mandated by the Taxpayer's 17 Bill of Rights (TABOR) as set forth in Article X, Section 20, Subsection (5) of the Colorado Constitution ,entitled "Emergency reserves." Funds utilized pursuant to this ordinance shall be 18 19 replenished no later than the conclusion of the fiscal year following the end of the current public 20 health emergency. 21 22 Section 11. Conflict With Other Laws: If any provision of this ordinance conflicts with 23 the Town Charter, the Town Charter shall control. If any provision of this ordinance conflicts 24 with any provision of the Breckenridge Town Code, or any provision of the Town Council's 25 Procedures and Rules of Order, this ordinance shall control. 26 27 Section 12. Police Power Finding. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and 28 declares that this ordinance is necessary and proper to provide for the safety, preserve the health, 29 promote the prosperity, and improve the order, comfort and convenience of the Town of 30 Breckenridge and the inhabitants thereof. 31 32 Section 13. Authority. The Town Council hereby finds, determines and declares that it 33 has the power to adopt this ordinance pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-15-401(1)(b) 34 C.R.S., and the powers possessed by home rule municipalities in Colorado, including, but not 35 limited to, Section 15.7 of the Breckenridge Town Charter entitled "Emergency Powers." 36 37 Section 14. Emergency Declaration. The Town Council of the Town of Breckenridge 38 hereby finds, determines and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is 39 necessary for the immediate preservation of public property, health, welfare, peace or safety for 40 the reasons enumerated in the introductory paragraphs of this ordinance, which are incorporated 41 into this Section 13 by reference. The Town Council further determines that the adoption of this 42 ordinance as an emergency ordinance is in the best interest of the citizens of the Town of 43 Breckenridge. 44

1 2 3 4	<u>Section 15.</u> <u>Effective Date</u> . Pursuant to Section 5.11 of the Breckenridge Town Charter this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon adoption of this ordinance by the affirmative votes of at least five (5) members of the Town Council.
4 5 6 7 8	Section 16. Publication of Ordinance. This ordinance shall be published in full within ten (10) days after adoption, or as soon thereafter as possible, as required by Section 5.11 of the Breckenridge Town Charter.
